Respect Life

In post Dobbs America, some states are making efforts to expand Medicaid coverage for postpartum mothers. The most recent victory in the attempt to deliver such assistance came in Mississippi when, on March 7, the state House passed a Medicaid postpartum coverage extension already approved by the state Senate. Low income mothers in the state will now be eligible for a full year of postpartum coverage instead of just 60 days. The 2021 American Rescue Plan Act allowed states to extend Medicaid pregnancy coverage from 60 days to one year postpartum—however, the provision expires in May. Wyoming Gov. Mark Gordon signed a similar bill into law March 3, calling it a "signature piece of pro-life legislation." We pray that more states will pass laws that provide pro-life support for women and their children.




