Pro-Life Corner

Bishop Robert E. Barron of Winona Rochester, Minnesota, chairman of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee for Laity, Marriage, Family Life and Youth, blasted the US Food and Drug Administration's July 13 announcement that it had approved the sale of a birth control pill without a prescription for the first time in the United States. "this action by a government entity flies in the face of responsible medical practice and concerns for women's health," Bishop Barron wrote in a release issued by the USCCB. "Claims that the benefits of this action outweigh the risks are unfounded, especially in light of strong evidence of the many harmful risks of hormonal contraception to women's health. Allowing this contraception to be dispensed without the supervision of a doctor and contrary to the mounting evidence of many harmful side effects puts the health of women at grave risk.
