

Short Summary of the Mission Appeal 2023 – October 14-15

Sri Lanka is a small Island, which is home to over 22 million people, in the Indian Ocean. It experienced a severe ethnic war for over 30 years and came to an end in 2009 in the region of the Diocese of Jaffna. According to UN reports, during the final battle in May 2009, more than 140,000 people died. The war also left thousands widowed, orphans, disabled, handicapped and homeless. Churches, Rectories and Mission Stations were also destroyed and razed to the ground. However, currently, the country is facing a worse economic and political crisis. The Diocese of Jaffna which is in the northern part of Sri Lanka encompasses over 200,000 faithful, 71 main Parishes, over 350 Churches, 140 diocesan Priests, 60 religious Priests, 250 male and female religious Brothers and Sisters and 502 volunteer catechists to serve our people. Each parish has more than 6 sub-stations. The Diocese has a private Catholic School – St. Patrick's College- that falls under the direct administration of the Bishop of Jaffna, where the poor children and many orphans receive their education free of charge.

Within the Diocese there are two seminaries, namely, St. Martin's Seminary (a minor Seminary) and St. Francis Xavier's Seminary (a major Seminary) which are for the contextual formation of the Tamil young men and for catering the educational and spiritual needs of young men aspiring to the priesthood. In addition, we have 52 diocesan major seminarians and 63 minor seminarians preparing themselves to go to the Major Seminary and a further 68 religious seminarians and 55 religious novices undergoing formation to serve in the diocese and around the world as priests and religious preachers. The Jaffna Diocesan Priests are sent as missionaries to various places in the world, including Canada and the USA. The following are some of our mission appeals for financial support:

- 1. Widows, orphans, disabled, handicapped and homeless.
- 2. Catholic Minor and Major Seminaries.
- 3. Catholic School of St. Patrick's College
- 4. Creating new parishes

Biographical Notes:

I am Fr. Terence Richard Oliver for the Diocese of Jaffna, Sri Lanka. I studied at St. Patrick's College, Jaffna. I received religious formation and education at St. Martin's Seminary and St. Francis Xavier's Seminary, Jaffna, Sri Lanka. I was ordained as a Priest by Rt. Revd. Dr. Justin Bernard Gnanapargasam, the Bishop of Jaffna, on the 15th of June 2017, Jaffna, Sri Lanka. I served as an Assistant Parish Priest at St. Mary's Cathedral, Jaffna for 7 months and was the Secretary to the Bishop of Jaffna until September 2021. I came to Belgium in the month of September 2021 for my Master Studies and I have completed my Master of Theology and Religious Studies at the University of KU Leuven, Bel-
