

The home is staffed 24/7 by trained professionals who provide support, guidance and assistance to help mothers grow and transform to reach independence.

Joseph's House staff design and implement life skills instruction and online self assessment tools for the mothers in our home that include lessons in nutrition, prenatal care, parenting, financial literacy, career planning, health education and healing. Both structured and unstructured community events provide the support and family environment that allows mothers and children to heal and grow.
