Bishop Moynihan Pro Vita Award

The Office of Family/Respect Life, Diocese of Syracuse is once again offering a scholarship in honor of the late <u>Bishop James Moynihan</u>. The Pro-Vita Award is available to any high school senior in the seven county diocese.

Bishop Moynihan was a fearless leader in the prolife movement. He was dedicated to building a Culture of Life, promoting vocations, and strengthening Catholic schools. Following Bishop Moynihan's passing in 2017, the Family/Respect Life office created the Pro Vita Award to honor his legacy. Funds are awarded based on submissions answering the following: *Why are you Pro-Life and how will you help build a culture of life?*

Submissions may be video, essay, song, music, pictures, art, (limited to 2 minutes of 500 words. Work must be submitted by email to familyrespectlife@syrdio.org by October 19, 2020

Awards will be presented at the Mass for Life with Bishop Lucia at the Cathedral, October 29, 2020. Contest is open to all Catholic students who reside in and attend private or public schools in the Syracuse Diocese.

The Pro-Vita Award grants two- \$1,000. and one \$500. scholarships to 3 high school students who will graduate in 2021. The scholarships will apply toward college tuition/expenses.

Bulletins

The distribution of bulletins has been changed to following Mass with the usher handing them out wearing gloves. The reason for this is because it is a safety issue. If you are given a bulletin after Mass in this fashion you are guaranteed no one else has touched your bulletin before you have. Also it eliminates the possibility that bulletins are left in the pew for the others to dispose of. We realize that for some people this is an inconvenience and that change is always hard to accept. Please understand this change is for your health and safety.

Receiving Communion

Communion will be distributed by the center aisle one side at a time. Please keep your mask on and receive the host in your hand. Step away from Father, Dc Tony or the Eucharistic Minister, slightly lift your mask and place the host in your mouth then reposition your mask and return by the side aisle.

Reservations for Mass

Please contact the Rectory on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday between the hours of 9-2 to make a reservation each week. We have noticed an increase in people attending Mass over the last several weeks. Each of our churches can only have a certain number of people present for each Mass. This would include. Priest, Deacon. Sacristan, Organist and Cantor. At St. Charles we can safely have 150, St. Ann's 64 and St. Patrick's and St. Brigid's 125 including the 5 people mentioned above. As the seasons change and parishioners start getting back into a routine the Mass participation may increase. If you have a reservation before Mass there will be a seat reserved for you. The reason reservation are needed is twofold: one to make sure we do not go over our allotted attendance figure and to have a call list in the event each person would need to be contacted. And most important we all must wear a mast at all times, be seated socially distant in a pew while in church.
