

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

# Q. Is giving online safe?

A. Yes. We implement the safest security standards for online transactions and your privacy is protected at all times. It is actually more secure than writing checks or bringing cash to church. Online contributions cannot be lost, stolen, or destroyed and have an extremely high rate of accuracy.

# Q. Which payment methods are accepted?

A. You have many options. Contributions from checking accounts, savings accounts, debit cards, and major credit cards (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express) are all accepted.

# Q. When will my account(s) be debited?

A. The choice is yours. When you enroll in our online program you can choose to have donations processed Weekly, Monthly, Semimonthly, Quarterly, Semiannually, or Annually.

# Q. What will my credit card statement say?

A. The name of our parish will appear on your bank or credit card statement.

# Q. Can any additional funds be taken from my account other than what I have authorized?

A. Absolutely not! Only the amount you authorized to give the church is taken. You are the only one that can change the amount of money that may be processed. You will also receive email reminders 2 days before your recurring transaction is set to occur so there will be no surprises.

# Q. What if I need to stop, increase, or decrease my donation?

A. You can make changes to your account at any time by logging into your account online 24/7 or by calling the parish office.

# Q. What if I change bank accounts or get a new debit or credit card?

A. Log in to your account online. You can log in to your account online at any time to update your payment source information.

# Q. Will I receive receipts for my donations?

A. Yes. All parishioners enrolled in online giving will receive receipts via email.

# Q. What if I feel uncomfortable not having something to physically drop into the collection basket?

A. Don't worry! You can print donation slips that can be placed into the collection basket as a visible sign of your electronic donations. These slips can be personalized with your Name and Church ID.

# **GOSPEL MEDITATION** ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.

five lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds



and be reconciled to our Creator.

Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Carist. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they
