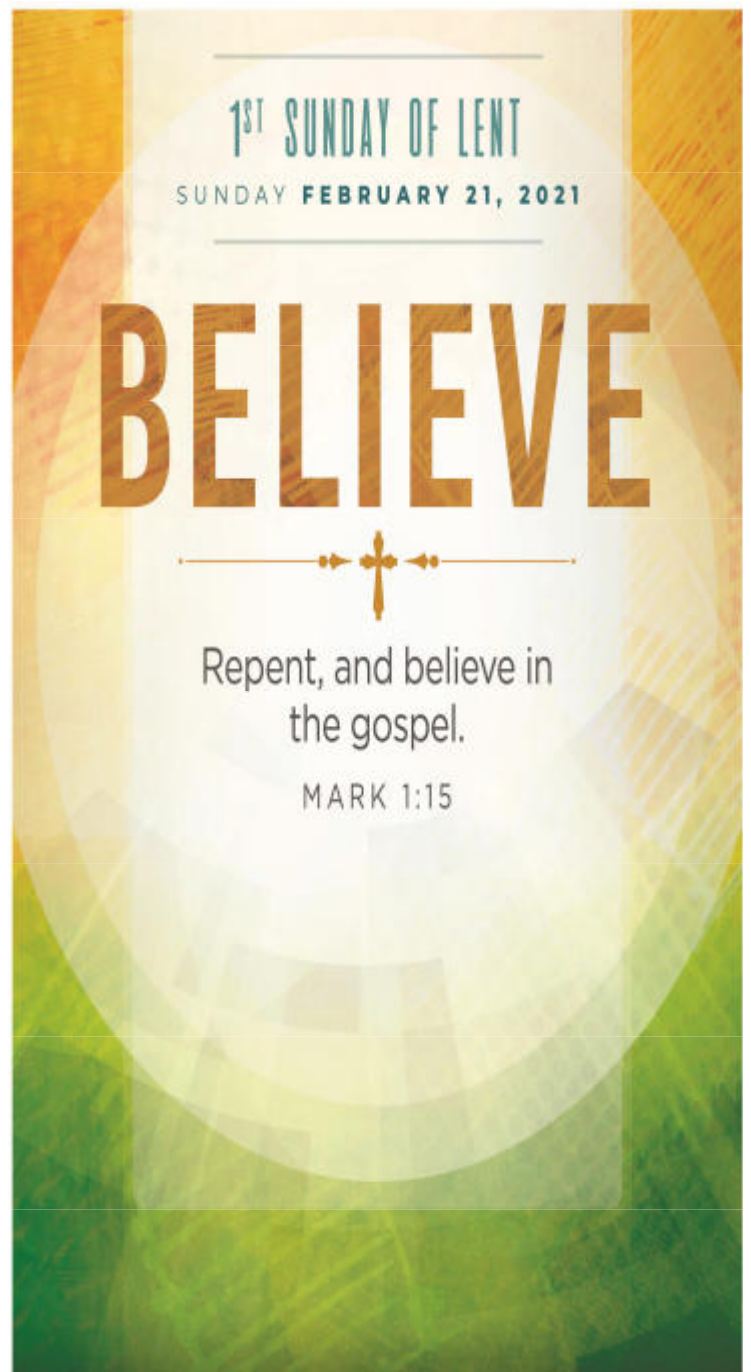

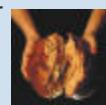

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

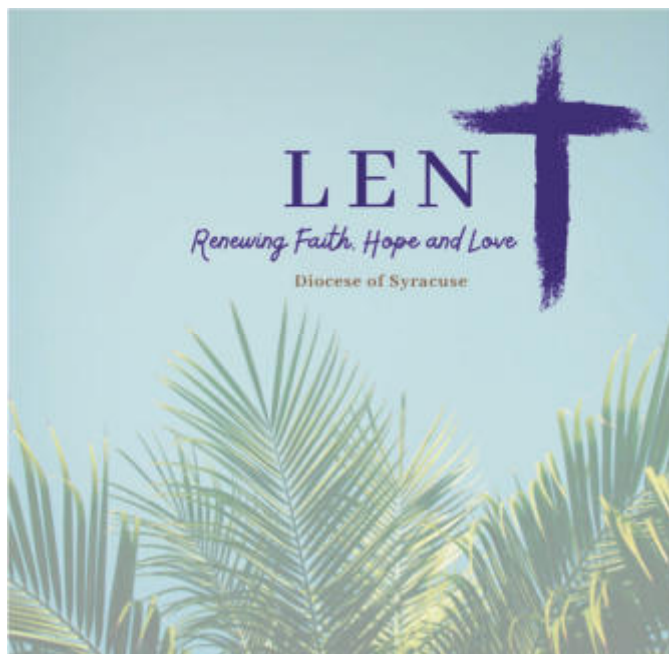

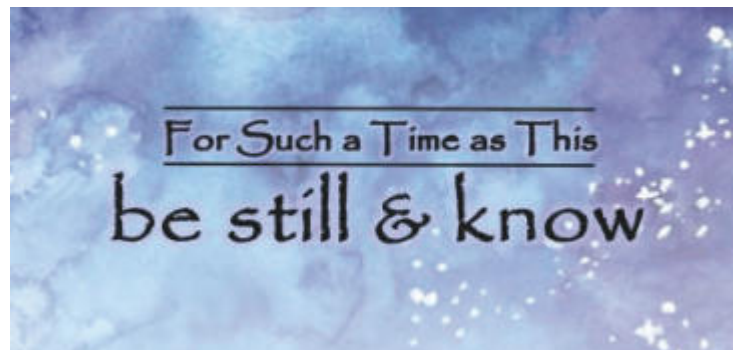
