Respect Life

On January 22– the 48th anniversary of the tragic decision by the US Supreme Court to legalize abortion on demand-President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris issued a statement saying that their administration "is committed to codifying Roe v. Wade and appointing judges that respect foundational precedents like Roe." statement drew a quick and sharp rebuke from the chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-life Activities, Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City, Kansas. "It is deeply disturbing and tragic that any president would praise and commit to codifying a Supreme Court ruling that denies unborn children their most basic human and civil right, the right to life, Archbishop Naumann wrote. Days earlier, Archbishop Jose H. Gomez, president of the USCCB, wrote that while he looked forward to working with Biden, he

"must point out that our new president has pledged to pursue certain policies that would advance more evils and threaten human life and dignity."






