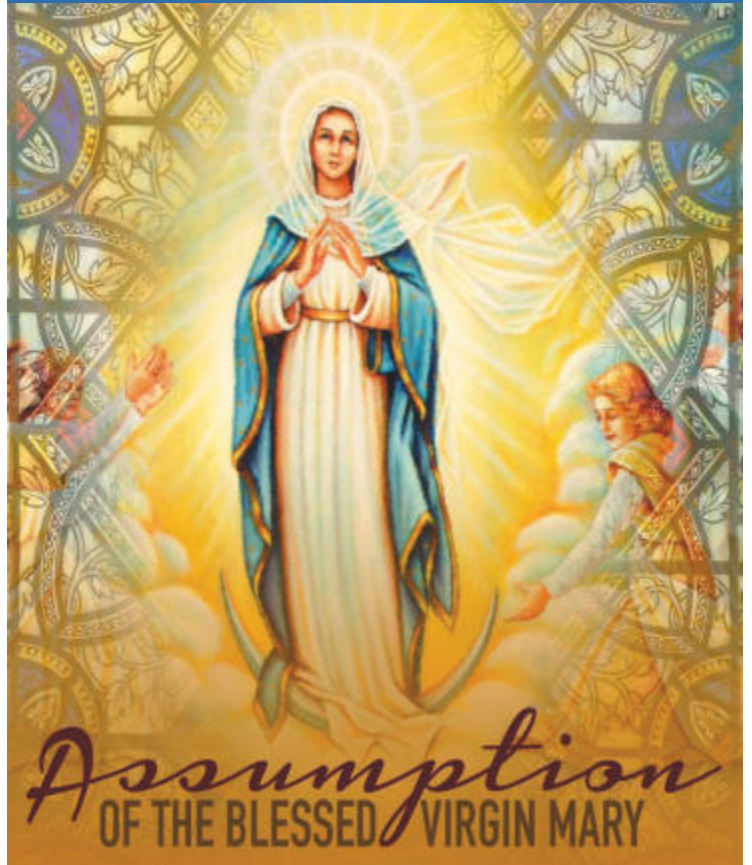

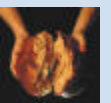

The Assumption

Question:

What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

Answer:

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

Ahiara Diocese: Ahiara Catholic Diocese is one of the most rural dioceses in Nigeria. It is one of the Southern poorest areas of the nation. There the government does not help to provide the people with the basic necessities of life and the people have no body to speak for them except the Bishop/priests and the Church. In this area, there is **no good food provision, no good water, no electricity. No hospitals and no health care provision of any kind.** Many people die in this community every day due to preventable and curable diseases.

Nigeria: The Super- Power of Africa with population close to three million people is seen today as one of the most dangerous and most corrupt nation of the world.

There is a great divide in Nigeria between the North and the South. The Northern- Muslims have controlled the political power of the nation all the years. The Southern- Christian Communities have suffered greatly from the Islamic leadership of Nigeria since her Independence in 1960.

Boko Haram and **Fulani Herdsmen** are some of the blood-thirsty Islamic extremists in Nigeria that go about killing the Christians. This situation brings poverty, hunger and bitterness in the life of every Christian faithful and their families. There is a high rate of insecurity every moment.

Boko Haram is a movement that sees Western Education and women's education as evil and forbidden. This situation is worsened by **COVID-19 Pandemic**, which the government does nothing about.

New York State: The communities in the Central New York area are helping to support the Christian faithful of Ahiara with cash and kind donations to improve their living conditions. The goal for this year's Mission Appeal is to help fight hunger and to help the people of Ahiara to build a clinic in order to help reduce the rate of mortality in the community.

Please, help us to help the people of Ahiara. No gift is too small for this project. There will be a second collection next weekend.

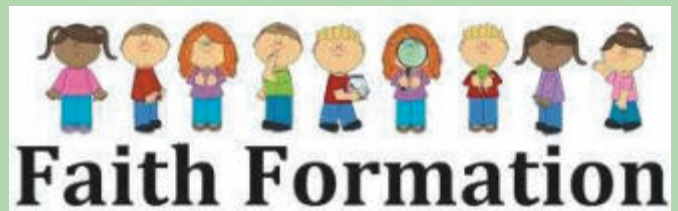

Respect Life

On April 15, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services proposed to rescind the Trump administration's enforcement of a Title X provision that distinguishes between abortion and family planning. Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City, Kansas, chair of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, quickly decried the proposition, calling it a "terrible policy." In an April 16th statement, he said that Title X "has repeatedly been co-opted by abortion supporters as a funding stream for organizations, programs and facilities that directly promote and provide abortions." We reiterate the archbishop's call that the Biden administration "suspend this proposed rule and leave the title X program as it was intended and authorized to be- a program entirely separate from abortion.
