Respect Life

New Mexico Senate passes assisted suicide legislation. Despite opposition from the Catholic bishops of New Mexico, the state Senate passed a bill in mid-March that would decriminalize assisted suicide. Should Democratic Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham sign the bill, the state will join seven others- California, Colorado, Hawaii, Montana, Oregon, Vermont and Washington, plus the District of Columbia- in legalizing assisted suicide. Earlier in March, Archbishop John Wester of Santa Fe decried the proposed law as "the worst in the nation." He added: "we continue to work to promote just laws, but know that God's law transcends any human laws. God's law calls us all to recognize and protect the life and dignity of each and every human being, especially the most vulnerable. This includes unborn children and those at the end of life. " We heartily agree.
