

### Respect Life

The U.S. Supreme Court announced it will hear oral arguments on Oct. 12 in a Kentucky case defending the state's abortion law, which bans abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Since the law was passed in 2018, its implementation has been blocked by the courts. The case has the backing of 20 state attorneys general. In his appeal to the Supreme Court, Kentucky Attorney General Daniel Cameron said the 6th Circuit Court's refusal to let him defend the law prevented him from doing his job. Cameron has said the abortion law "reflects the conscience of Kentucky by banning the gruesome practice of live dismemberment abortions." In the upcoming

session, the Supreme Court will also hear an appeal of a Mississippi law that bans abortions after 15 weeks. We hope the court will legally protect the dignity of all human life.
