



#### Federal court strikes down Tennessee abortion restrictions

On Sept. 10, the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals ruled against a 2020 Tennessee law that would restrict abortions at several stages in pregnancy, including abortions conducted after the detection of a fetal heartbeat, which can occur as early as six weeks post-gestation. It would also prohibit abortions chosen on the basis of the race, sex or Down syndrome diagnosis of the baby. The Susan B. Anthony List, a pro-life group, stated on Twitter that the ruling was "disappointing" and that the state's pro-life provisions were "commonsense". The ruling came less than two weeks after Texas' "heartbeat" law went into effect. While pro-lifers may be dejected by the ruling, all eyes are on a Mississippi case that would prohibit most abortions after 15 weeks, which will soon be heard by the Supreme Court on December 1.






