Archbishop Lori: Ruling on medical abortion puts lives at risk

The U.S. Food and Drub administration announced December 16 that it would permanently lift its requirement that a prescription for the abortion drug mifepristonebe be picked up in person, allowing it to be sent directly to the patient by mail or through a mail order pharmacy. Later that day, Baltimore Archbishop William E. Lori, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, said, "Far from the accompaniment that women in crisis pregnancies deserve, this decision would leave women alone in the midst of

trauma, often without any medical attention or follow-up care." The FDA, he said, is "merely succumbing to the abortion industry's pressure to loosen safety standards," instead of protecting the lives and health of mothers and children as it should do. We heartily agree.
