New Zealand OK's euthanasia for COVID patients

Just days before Christmas, the government of New Zealand declared that patients admitted to a hospital with COVID-19 can die by euthanasia if doctors decide they might not survive. The Ministry of Health said the nation's new euthanasia law, which came into effect in November, could be extended to COVID-19 patients who were dying from the coronavirus or suffering unbearable from its consequences. Many consider the 2019 End of Life Choice Act to be one of the most extreme euthanasia laws in the world, and some even speculated

prior to this announcement that it could be used to include COVID 19 patients. The Catechism of the Catholic Church clearly teaches that euthanasia "is morally unacceptable" in all situations (No. 2277). We are called to care for those who are suffering, not kill them.
