#### Respect Life

On March 8, the city council of Alexandria, VA, was set to consider a proclamation that was to recognize March 10 as "Abortion Provider Appreciation Day." According to the proclamation, this day would "celebrate the courage, compassion and the high quality care that abortion providers and clinic staff provide." Bishop Michael Burbridge of Arlington spoke out against the proposal and called on Catholic residents of Alexandria "to express their opposition to this proclamation," and for everyone else in the diocese to "proclaim the Gospel of life by word and example." However, following the outcry, Mayor Justin Wilson of Alexandria pulled the item from the agenda. We thank Bishop Burbridge for speaking out so strongly, and we implore Catholics to continue to speak out against all glorification of abortion.


