Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners and friends, we have been providing 70 gallons of milk each and every week to local pantries. St. Lucy's Food Pantry receives 30 gallons and Assumption Food Pantry receives 40 gallons each week. Milk is not provided or sold by the Food Bank and these pantries rely on our generosity. We are about to begin the 9th year of the Milk Mission and we are sending a plea out to all those who have not yet donated or have not been part of the Milk Mission.

When we started this ministry, milk cost around \$1.89 a gallon - it is now up to \$3.29 a gallon. All we have ever asked for is for \$10 a month from donors or \$120.00 for the year. We have sent out our annual plea letter and are so thankful to all who have already responded. We pray we hear from the rest of our donors, but even if all contributed we do not have enough to pay for the year. Please if you can help out this year, consider joining our Milk Mission. All the money goes to milk, nothing else!

You can also contact Terri Condon at condon.tmc@gmail.com and she will send out mailing labels that can be used each month. I know that God is good and that this Milk Mission will continue. It's a simple way to put milk on the tables of those in need in our very own city. Thank you for your constant generosity and God bless you all for all you do!
