




The **FIRST** Thursday of the month we have a holy hour 3-4pm with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

## Respect Life

On March 10, the U.S. Senate passed a \$1.5 trillion government funding bill that included the Hyde Amendment and other pro-life provisions after the House had passed it a day earlier. The Hyde Amendment has been reenacted in spending bills every year since 1976 to prevent tax dollars from funding abortions. The chairmen of five US Conference of Catholic Bishops' committees commended the lawmakers for "including provisions in the omnibus appropriations

package that uphold the sacred dignity of human life. They said in a March 11 statement. The bill, which was sent to President Joe Biden for his signature had been debated for months, and in the end, the protections stayed in order.
