

Hope appeal Update as of February 8, 2023

Dear Members of our parish community,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their continued support and generosity. It is with gratitude that I am humbled and pleased to be able to say we at St. Patrick' and St. Brigid's are able to pay our 2022 Hope Appeal assessed amount of \$35,669.15 in full due to your generous donations and pledges.

Our parish continues to be a vibrant faith filled community thanks to people like you. We have a solid foundation. We are a worshipping community. We offer ministries to people from birth to death. The "we" is all of us. We are a family. We are the body of Christ, the Church. We rely and depend on each other to step forward and use our God-given skills and talents in a faithful way.

Dear Fellow SCSA Parishioners,

We want to provide you with an update on the sale of the St Ann's Campus.

The process of selling the St. Ann's property began shortly after the August Town Hall meeting. We as Trustees signed a resolution addressed to Bishop Lucia asking his permission to sell the St Ann's Campus and to hire a commercial real estate firm to develop a marketing plan for the property's sale. The property has generated significant interest and we have received numerous offers. Several of the prospective buyers have asked that the offer remain confidential until a final agreement is reached and we have worked to honor those requests.

On January 9, 2023 the Bishop issued a "Decree" allowing us to proceed with the sale of the property. This Decree was made public on the diocesan website, in The Catholic Sun and in our parish bulletin. We were not allowed to enter any agreements until the Decree process was properly completed. The Decree period ended on January 16, 2023. We are in serious discussions with a prospective buyer but there is no written agreement. The lawyers for the parish, Chancery and buyer are currently working to craft an agreement acceptable to all parties. There are several contingencies to work through and be resolved. A final written offer may be several weeks away. Until that final agreement is signed, we will continue to honor our commitment of confidentiality. After the written purchase agreement is signed, the final sale of the St Ann's Campus may take six months or longer to complete.

As many of us know from buying and selling our own home, negotiating the sale of property and the path towards a closing is filled with twists and turns. One of those twists is the bankruptcy filing of the Diocese of Syracuse. We need to know if this filing will have any impact on the availability and use of the sale proceeds. We are currently awaiting a legal opinion from the lawyers of the Diocese.

Selling church property brings its own unique circumstances and requires the following of both Canon and New Your State laws. As trustees, we have worked with our realtor, attorney and Fr. Kevin to evaluate the offers and the requirements to achieve a sale. Any agreement to sell must satisfy the requirements of Canon Law and be approved by Bishop Lucia.

Once we have the written agreement to sell we will notify you through email and the bulletin.

We appreciate your trust and patience as we work through this process.


