

Since the draft opinion overturning Roe vs. Wade was leaked in May 2022, Catholic Vote has tracked 78 attacks against pregnancy resource centers and offices of pro-life organizations. These have included fire bombings, bricks through windows and other property destructions, threatening graffiti, keying of employees' cars, nails scattered in parking lots and other acts of violence. Pregnancy resource centers have had to spend precious dollars on extra security. To date, there have been no arrests. This is not because of a lack of effort by local law enforcement, it is because they need federal help to fight a nationwide wave of violence.




