

Bishop Rhoades: Notre Dame Lecture



Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades of the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, Indiana, said that a lecture series on "reproductive justice" at the University of Notre Dame is advancing "activist propaganda" rather than conducting a neutral inquiry or exploring the debates within this field.
