Many of us think of the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA/now OCIA) as a way to bring non-Catholics into the fullness of our faith. That's true...to a point. But it's also the way to bring back those who have chosen for one reason or another not to join us in living out their lives in the fullness of the Catholic faith which they received at Baptism.

Beginning Sunday, November 5th and running through Sunday, Nov. 19th we will be holding Inquiry sessions from 9:15-10:15 at St. Charles Church. This will allow time for folks inviting someone to attend either Sunday Mass. These are informal "Come and See" opportunities for both those of different or no faiths who might be interested in learning more about becoming Catholic, as well as those Pope Francis refers to as "currently on different roads."

Sessions will be held on Nov. 5, 12, and 19..... the RCIA Team looks forward to finding new roads together ... because to quote Pope Francis again: "Faith is only worth having when you give it away."
