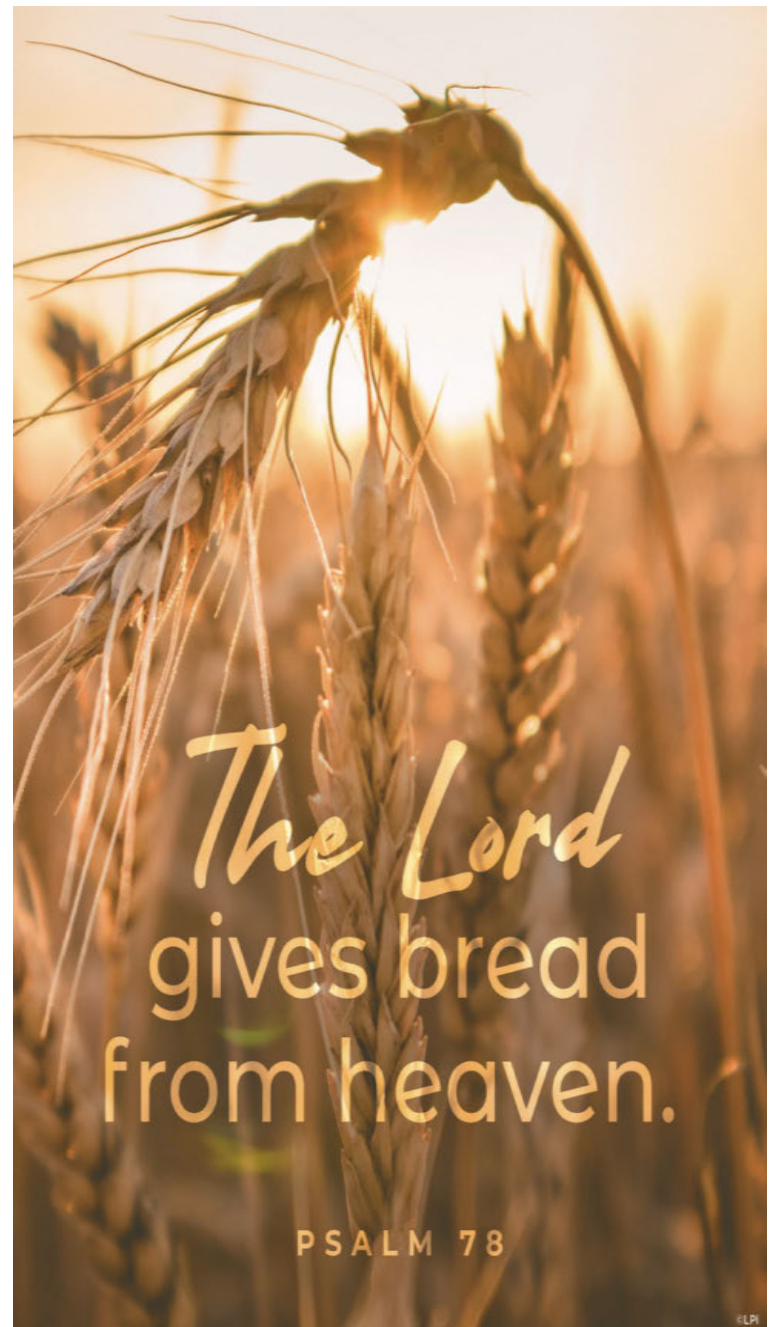

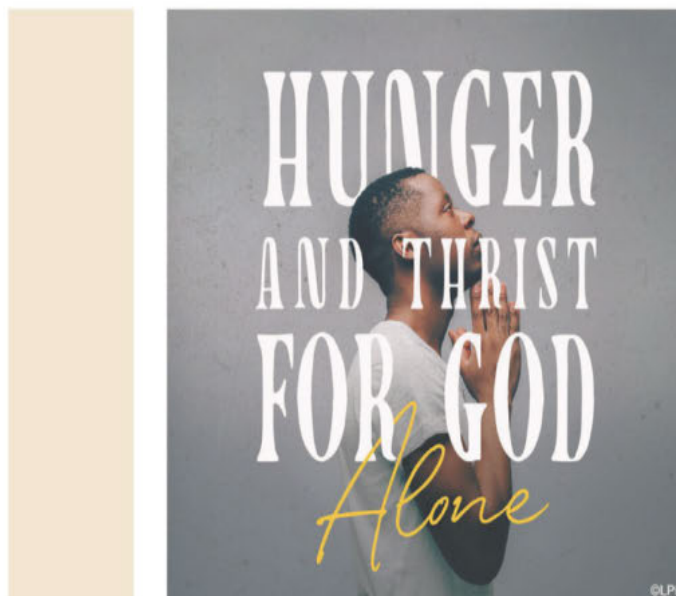

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Since my college days I've loved a song called "Dance with You" by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: "I've tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for." These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus' words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God's gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.


We will get to the Lord's teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you'll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for.

Matthew 25 Farm is looking for volunteers to help with the harvest of their many vegetables.

As you may recall Matthew 25 is a local farm that supplies fresh produce to local food pantries in Syracuse.

Monday through Friday: 9am-noon; and 1-4pm. With the hot weather we encourage the morning time, but both are available. Saturday: 9-noon and they are closed on Sunday.

Children and teens need to be accompanied by an adult/guardian. Families are always welcome, as are individuals/groups. We ask that no one wear open toed shoes, and each volunteer/family must sign a waiver and consent form the first time they come.

Please keep the farm in your prayers.

Matthew 25 Farm was chosen as one of 20 winners in the 2024 Kubota Hometown Proud Grant. Every winner is guaranteed \$10,000., but those with the most votes will win \$50,000.

Our project is for a third high tunnel house, and a propane heating system, which will allow us to grow year-round and donate thousands of pounds more of fresh produce.

We are asking everyone to vote for us from August 1st through August 14th. The site is

If anyone is interested in volunteering some time occasionally to help out our seniors, please call the parish office and we will begin a list of those that are willing and able to help.

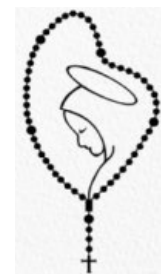

A thank you from another pantry...

It was such a wonderful surprise when Amy presented your check to St. Mark's congregation for our food pantry.

We are serving 100 families a week. Today we handed out 60 prepacked food boxes and eggs, apples, salad, nectarines, milk, juice, cheese and meat to 118 adults, 56 children and 48 seniors.

We open two days a week, Tuesday and Saturday from 9-12pm. Each year we see more families depending on food from us.

In 2023 we handed out 377 baskets for the month of June. This June, 544 baskets, 1,119 adults, 496 children and 456 seniors. So as you can see the need is growing.

We just wanted to let you know how much you are appreciated.

A new approach to our Food Pantries

In conjunction with both of our parish food pantries, a monthly theme will be announced to make it easier and simpler to remember what is needed. Reminders of each month's themes will appear in the bulletin along with colorful signs at each collection point. In August we will be collecting school supplies such as book bags, pencils, crayons (24 count preferred), spiral notebooks, loose-leaf paper, binders, and socks. We hope this new method will benefit both you and our pantries!
