

Birthright of Syracuse helps women who are pregnant or new Moms who are in need of emergency supplies. We provide non-judgmental support to any woman in need, no matter her age, race, circumstances, religion, marital status or financial situation. We are staffed by volunteers 4 days a week and will provide a new Mom with a layette which includes blankets, diapers, wipes, baby wash/shampoo, bibs, onesies, sleepers, outfits, sleep sack, hand mitts, winter coat, hats, sweaters, bath towels, wash clothes, bottles, burp clothes, socks, pacifiers, a toy, and book in every layette.

A Mom may come into Birthright with other children in need of clothing, shoes, winter clothing etc. We will do everything we can to assist the Mom and children. If the Mom has no winter coat we will provide her with one. Because we are there for emergencies we provide our Moms with an extensive resource list that will give them contacts to get diapers monthly, assist them with food pantry locations, contacts to get into housing etc.

For our Lenten commitment at St. Charles-St. Ann and St. Patrick and St. Brigid, we are accepting items for layettes as well as clothes for children from newborn up to 12 years of age. They can be new or gently used. There are bins in the entrance of the church if you would like to donate to help.
