




As we continue our shared mission of building a community rooted in faith, love, and service, we remain committed to enhancing our Safe Environment protocols. Raising these safeguarding standards fosters a diocesan family where children, youth, and vulnerable adults are valued, safe, and protected from harm, while upholding a zero-tolerance culture for abuse. This dedication reflects our Christian calling to love and serve one another, ensuring the protection and well-being of all entrusted to our care.

With direction and support from the Diocesan Review Board, the Safe Environment Committee, and the Office of Safe Environment, the diocese will require all liturgical ministers to complete Safe Environment training and undergo a criminal background check, effective March 1, 2025.

Why this important decision? All liturgical ministers play an essential role in the Church, with responsibilities extending beyond their specific duties. Whether lector, Eucharistic minister, cantor or serving in any other capacity, their involvement nurtures the spiritual life of our parishes. Liturgical ministers also serve as examples of trustworthiness and safety for all parishioners. While many may not have regular, direct contact with children, youth, or vulnerable individuals, it's important that all who serve in these roles be viewed as safe adults by everyone attending worship, regardless of age.

Thank you for your understanding, cooperation, and support as we take this important step to protect the dignity of all <u>we</u> serve. I know you share my commitment to safeguarding and caring for the children, youth, and vulnerable adults in our diocese. Please continue to pray for us as we work together to protect all of God's children.

Milk Mission

April 1st begins our 12th year of the Milk Mission. The Milk Mission supplies much needed gallons of milk to those in need in our inner city. Thanks to our generous parishioners and friends, each week we purchase 90 gallons of milk: 60 gallons goes to Assumption Food Pantry and 30 gallons goes to St. Lucy's Food Pantry. Twelve years ago, milk cost \$1.89 per gallon and all we ask from parishioners and friends is to donate \$10 a month or \$120 for the year. Milk has gone up to \$3.19 and we have not asked for more than \$10 a month. We have over 60 people who donated last year and many gave above and beyond the \$120 for the year. The sad realization is that Assumption Food Pantry now gets 80 families in one day – the 60 gallons of milk only last about a day.

We, along with Assumption Food Pantry and St. Lucy's Food Pantry, are so grateful to the people who have donated all these years, but the need is greater than ever. I have never seen so many lined up at the window at Assumption each week as I have seen this year. Please if you can join in, consider helping in this much needed mission. I promise that all money collected goes directly to purchasing milk. If you think about it, you can't even buy a good pizza for \$10 a month.
