

As we continue our shared mission of building a community rooted in faith, love, and service, we remain committed to enhancing our Safe Environment protocols. Raising these safeguarding standards fosters a diocesan family where children, youth, and vulnerable adults are valued, safe, and protected from harm, while upholding a zero-tolerance culture for abuse. This dedication reflects our Christian calling to love and serve one another, ensuring the protection and well-being of all entrusted to our care.

With direction and support from the Diocesan Review Board, the Safe Environment Committee, and the Office of Safe Environment, the diocese will require all liturgical ministers to complete Safe Environment training and undergo a criminal background check, effective March 1, 2025.

Why this important decision? All liturgical ministers play an essential role in the Church, with responsibilities extending beyond their specific duties. Whether lector, Eucharistic minister, cantor or serving in any other capacity, their involvement nurtures the spiritual life of our parishes. Liturgical ministers also serve as examples of trustworthiness and safety for all parishioners. While many may not have regular, direct contact with children, youth, or vulnerable individuals, it's important that all who serve in these roles be viewed as safe adults by everyone attending worship, regardless of age.

Thank you for your understanding, cooperation, and support as we take this important step to protect the dignity of all <u>we</u> serve. I know you share my commitment to safeguarding and caring for the children, youth, and vulnerable adults in our diocese. Please continue to pray for us as we work together to protect all of God's children.
