## Epiphany

### A Family Perspective by Bud Ozar Epiphany

Today's gospel tells us "all Jerusalem" was upset because "King Herod was deeply troubled." A similar ripple effect happens in families; one person's negative attitude can affect the whole family. If you want a peaceful and joyful home, it must start with you.  
Be peaceful and joyful.

*Today is the feast of the Epiphany.  
This is the day we acknowledge a visit from the Magi  
(members of a priestly caste of ancient Persia, today  
known as Iran). Most of us retell the story of the  
3 Magi-Balthazar, Caspar, and Melchior.  
But in the Gospel of Matthew there is a 4th Magi named  
Artaban, one of the Medes from Persia. Like the other  
Magi, he sees signs in the heavens proclaiming that a  
King had been born among the Jews. Like them, he sets  
out to see the newborn ruler, carrying treasures to give  
as gifts to the child - a sapphire, a ruby, and a "pearl of  
great price". However, he stops along the way to help a  
dying man, which makes him late to meet with the car-  
avan of the other three wise men. Because he missed the  
caravan, and he can't cross the desert with only a horse,  
he is forced to sell one of his treasures in order to buy  
the camels and supplies necessary for the trip. He then  
commences his journey but arrives in Bethlehem too  
late to see the child, whose parents have fled to Egypt.  
He saves the life of a child at the price of another of his  
treasures. He then travels to Egypt and to many other  
countries, searching for Jesus for many years and per-  
forming acts of charity along the way. After 33 years,  
Artaban is still a pilgrim, and a seeker after light. Arta-  
ban arrives in Jerusalem just in time for the crucifixion  
of Jesus. He spends his last treasure, the pearl, to ransom  
a young woman from being sold into slavery. He is then  
struck in the head by a falling roof tile and is about to  
die, having failed in his quest to find Jesus, but having  
done much good through charitable works. A voice tells  
him "Verily I say unto thee, Inasmuch as thou hast done  
it unto one of the least of these my brethren, thou hast  
done it unto me."(Matthew 25:40)<sup>[4]</sup> He dies in a calm  
radiance of wonder and joy. His treasures were  
accepted, and the Other Wise Man found his King*

**BAPTISM:** Usually scheduled for Sunday during or after Mass. Parents should first contact the pastor for an appointment and also plan on attending one session of our Baptismal Preparation Program, which explains the significance of the sacrament and each part of the Baptismal rite. Many parents may find it more convenient to attend this session during pregnancy rather than after the birth of their child. We rejoice with joy in your happiness!

**MARRIAGE:** Congratulations! We want to do everything we can to make this day special for you. Couples should be members of the parish and make an appointment with the pastor at least six months before the desired date of the wedding. Participation in some form of Pre-Cana conference is necessary.

**HOSPITAL:** Please notify us if you or a member of your family enters the hospital so that they will be able to receive the healing Sacraments of Anointing of the Sick and the Eucharist.

**HOMEBOUND:** There may be times when you may not be able to get to Mass because of illness or the weather. If this is the case, please let us know so that we will be able to bring you Communion. Also, if you know of anyone who is permanently homebound, please let us know so that we will be able to schedule frequent Communion visitations.

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** Welcome to our community!  
Please register at the rectory as soon as possible

**What is the proper way to carry the Holy Eucharist**

*If you are bringing Communion to the homebound or to a loved one, you need to use sacred vessel known as a pyx. A pyx is the small round metal case (usually gold-plated) used to carry a few hosts. Other containers such as cloth or tissue paper should not be used. You can borrow a pyx from Church at anytime. Please see either Fr. Kevin or Michael before or after Mass. If you have borrowed a pyx in the past and are no longer in need of it's use, please return it so others will be able to use it.*

*As you know, it is a great privilege to serve as a minister in the church. We always welcome new ministers. If you would like to be trained to serve as an altar server, lector, or Eucharistic Minister, we welcome and encourage you to do so. Please contact the rectory for more information*
