

"Catch'em Being Good" contest for altar servers



### Respect Life

After attending the Jan. 20 March for Life, a group of Catholic students were kicked out of the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum in Washington, DC, for wearing pro-life hats. After the march, the 12 students from Our Lady of the Rosary School in Greenville, SC, and their chaperones visited the museum still wearing their blue stocking caps that said "Rosary Pro-Life." According to attorney Jordan Sekulow of the American Center for Law and Justice, the students "were accosted several times and told they would be forced to leave unless they removed their pro-life hats." Catholic News Agency reported that at least two of the students are being represented by the American Center for Law and Justice. Should it go to court, the case would be another in the continuing fight for religious liberty.
